"I Surrender All" March 19, 2023

One of my favorite hymns of all times is "I Surrender All." I remember growing up and almost every other week, this was our hymn of invitation. I remember the fact that I had sung it so much that I didn't even need to look in the hymnal anymore. I knew every word and was willing to truly belt it out as loud as I could sing.

Later in life, when I was able to fully read and understand notes, I found myself enjoying the opportunity to sing the bass line for the hymns. Now, stop me if you know where I am going, but I LOVED the chorus for "I Surrender All." I remember that as soon as the sopranos and altos would sing their part of the chorus, I would come in with an enthusiastic "I Surrender All" in the deepest bass voice I could muster. It was a time when I passionately felt the power of God jumping off of the pages and settling into my heart. I was so ready to sing this song because I knew the melody, words and notes, and was ready to sing my part…but to that point in my spiritual journey I had not fully understood the true meaning of the song.

Have you ever thought about that reality for your life? Are there songs or sayings like Amazing Grace, the Lord's Prayer or the Apostle's Creed that we have spoken countless times but never stopped to understand fully the words that we are saying? We just know that we are to recite these words or sing these songs at certain times in the service, but we have not fully applied the meaning of the words to our everyday life. I find that for a lot of us these songs and words hold such deep connection but sometimes we truly forget to live out the actions that God is calling us to fulfill through His Word.

The hymn starts, *All to Jesus I surrender*, *All to Him I freely give. I will ever love and trust Him, in His presence daily live. I surrender all... I surrender all... All to Thee my blessed Savior, I surrender ALL.* If I wrote out each verse, you would probably be able to pause and take a second to see what I am talking about when it comes to us living out the words we are professing. ALL to Jesus I surrender... ALL to HIM I FREELY give. I am professing that I am surrendering every ounce of my authority, my being, my family, my finances... MY ALL to Jesus freely. Jesus came and set for us an example of what we are supposed to do as He continued His journey towards the cross and the grave. Jesus had all the authority to change the world, but through his humility, love and mercy for us, He loosed Himself and came to walk with us in love.

The example that we are to live out is in humility. We are called to surrender all. As I would boldly step into my part of the chorus each time we sang the hymn, Hymn 354 in our hymnals, I should also boldly surrender all that I have in order that God would be glorified. This journey that we walk with Christ during Lent is our opportunity to understand the call to <u>fully</u> surrender our ALL. In a world that is so dedicated to accumulating all that one can as a definition of success, may we honestly take a step back and realize that we are called to lose our hold on life in order to truly gain eternity. As Jesus flipped the script on everything the world understands about life, may we boldly surrender our ALL in order that God may be glorified once again.


