WYNNTON NEIGHBORHOOD NETWORK

August was a record crushing month for us. We served 667 families last month. That's 150 more families than our previous August record and about 50 more than our all-time record holiday month. Many of the people who are coming to us have never been to a pantry before. To make matters worse, food continues to be scarce in the government food program for families with children. The good news is that we are still able to get a fair amount of fresh produce. We also broke a record in demand for utility assistance. We assisted a record 88 families, 10 more than our previous record in August of last year.

As always, we rely on your generosity to be able to provide needy Columbus families with food and utility assistance. We ask that you especially remember us when it is your congregation's month to provide non-perishable food items. If you prefer to give money, we'll be happy to do the shopping for you. To be able to handle the increased demand, we are looking for a few more volunteers who are able to work during the week, 10:00-12:30. Most volunteers work one day a week or every other week.
