"Which Thief Would We Be?"

February 25, 2024

As we continue our journey through the Words to Live By, we step into a situation that we have all read through before during lent. In the midst of his journey to the cross, Jesus is met with two individuals that He has not met before. They are both sentenced to die a death of public humiliation and suffering on their cross for crimes we have no idea they have committed. All we know is that they were chosen to be a part of the story of Christ's final hours.

Recognize that all four Gospels tell of the presence of the two criminals that were led to Golgotha that same day as Christ, but only the Gospel of Luke allows us to have an intentional viewpoint of their character before their death. Luke 23:39-42 allows us to see into their stories as Christ encounters them on the worst day of His life. Luke writes:

39 One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" **40** But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? 41 We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong." **42** Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." (Luke 23:39-42)

Two very different portrayals of these characters who were also pledged to die beside the Son of God. One whose heart was still hardened or calloused and represented the world who was ready to see the Son of God destroyed and ridiculed on the cross. The second, a criminal who understood his place and the ramification of his actions, yet still recognized the authority of Christ and humbly asked in his dying moments to just be remembered. One thief cursed God and almost expected Christ to give him something he did not deserve in freedom from his situation. The other thief realizing he had done wrong and recognized the authority of Christ, even through His suffering, and in humility requesting that Christ would just remember him as a dying man fulfilling his debt through death.

Many times, I think through which thief I would represent. I know the simple and easy answer would be that I would be the second thief. Recognizing my faults and failures and in humility coming before Christ and asking for Him to remember me. Unfortunately, there are many days in which we all would fall under the category of the first thief. We are so demanding of Christ in asking Him to fulfill our desires and our needs in the way we want them to be fulfilled. I could easily hear my voice in the words spoken by the first thief, but maybe not using the same words. My words would sound more like, "Jesus, you know my heart and my needs, why am I going through this situation? You know my desires. Why are you not fulfilling my prayers and helping me?" Sound familiar?

I know that this may seem very critical today as we look at the second teaching from Christ on the cross, but I honestly believe that many days we could have the attitude of either thief. One day we are humble and asking for forgiveness, and the next day we are demanding that our request be fulfilled now. What a difficult challenge to face each day, but one to intentionally draw us closer to God. During this Lenten season, may we pause and reflect on the words Christ spoke to help us live out our lives as He gazed at us from the cross.

JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!



This Sunday, the second Sunday in Lent, our Chancel Choir will bring a powerful message acclaiming the unconditional, unchanging, and eternal love that is poured out on all of creation; especially those who have put their faith in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Our anthem for this Sunday is Dan Forrest's profoundly beautiful "And Can It Be?" based on a Charles Wesley hymn. Charles Wesley was a prolific hymn writer. From the time of his conversion in 1738. Wesley wrote an average of two hymns a week for fifty years; between five and six thousand hymns in his lifetime. It has been said that Charles Wesley composed his hymns to bring theology to the heart, where people experience God's love in profound ways. After completing his studies at Oxford, Charles volunteered to travel to Georgia, a new colony in America, as a missionary. His experience did not go well and he left America ill and depressed. Finding himself in a spiritual crisis, he started attending meetings led by Moravian Christian, Peter Boehler. On Sunday, May 21, 1738, Charles Wesley wrote, "I now find myself at peace with God, and rejoiced in the hope of loving Christ. I saw that by faith I stood." On Tuesday, May 23, Wesley wrote in his journal "I began a hymn upon my conversion." There is no definitive proof, but many historians believe the hymn written in response to his conversion was "And Can it Be?"

And can it be? And can it be? Amazing love, how can it be? And can it be that I should gain an interest in the Savior's blood? Died He for me who caused His pain? For me who Him to death pursued Amazing Love! How can it be that Thou my God, shouldst die for me? He left His Father's throne above, so free, so infinite His grace; Emptied Himself of all but love, and bled for Adam's helpless race; 'Tis mercy all, immense and free; for, O my God, it found out me.

And can it be? And can it be? Amazing love, how can it be? No condemnation now I dread, Jesus and all in Him is mine!

Alive in Him, my living Head, and clothed in righteousness divine, bold I approach th'eternal throne, and claim the crown through Christ my own. Amazing love, how can it be that Thou, my God shouldst die for me?

Romans 5:8

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
