

Love God, Love People and Serve Together

"Together..." April 7, 2024

For the next 40 days, Jesus spent time TOGETHER with His disciples preparing them for the next steps of their journey. Jesus was intentional about showing them about the power of the gospel, the meaning of true grace, and helping them to understand how to grow in their ability to grow the kingdom through equipping disciples to go into the world. Jesus was intentional about spending time TOGETHER with the disciples as He was preparing them to be intentional about sharing the Gospel to the world.

Over the next few weeks, we are going to engage into a deeper understanding of the word TOGETHER. For the Church to continue to grow, we have to be willing to recognize that God has given us a chance to be intentional in our relationships with the Word, with the World and with each other. One of the most important aspects of the Church is how we live and serve as the Church every day and not just on Sundays. Wynnton has truly been a blessing because you have been willing to trust in my leadership and vision to come TOGETHER and BE THE CHURCH to a world that is in such need for community and connection.

In preparation for this journey, I encourage us all to read about the church at Philippi through Luke's historical account in Acts 16. What is significant about this church plant was that it was the first such effort in Europe. Paul had been trying to take the Gospel east to Asia (see 16:6-8). The Spirit of Jesus did not permit Paul and his team to go in that direction, but instead gave him directions to go west. Many have said that the Gospel has spread westward since that time and will continue to do so until it returns to where it started—in the Middle East.

Paul received his "call" to go west in a night vision. "During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.' After Paul had seen the vision, we got ready at once to leave for Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them" (Acts 16:9-10). It is of note that Paul and his team "got ready at once" to go to Macedonia. They concluded that God wanted them to go there TOGETHER. In other words, Paul and his team used their brains. They reasoned that God wanted them to preach the gospel somewhere. Since they had been trying to do just that but felt resisted, they assumed that this vision was from God. The whole team, TOGETHER, received the vision, even though Paul was the only one who saw the man calling him over. They didn't "pray about it," but rather they set out immediately.

I hope and pray that you are ready to take the next steps with me over the next three weeks as we dive into Paul's relationship with the church at Philippi. Philippi was the location for the first church plant as Paul had been preparing to carry the Gospel to whoever and wherever God had called him to go. In Paul's second letter to Timothy, he reminds us, as carriers of the Gospel, that we too must be prepared in and out of season to preach the Word, correct, rebuke and encourage with great patience and careful instruction (2 Timothy 4:2). We are called to grow TOGETHER and go and teach the Gospel to everyone we encounter. When Jesus walked out of the tomb, we were given the Great Commission in the Book of Matthew 28:19-20 to, "Go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." God has called the Church to work TOGETHER to teach, preach and equip others with the Gospel.
