Even though there are times that we too go astray and seek a place of shelter, Jesus is right there to place us on His shoulders and watch over us throughout the day. READING THROUGH THE BIBLE

Innkeeper and Shepherds: December 17-22 Luke 2:1-7, Luke 2:8-20



This week we will be reading about the Shepherds and the Innkeeper. The innkeeper is often overlooked, because as you might notice when you read through the first set of verses, there is no mention of an innkeeper. But we know that there was no room for them in town, so what we attribute to one innkeeper could've been any number of residents who turned aside the mother of Christ. Everything turned out so the Savior of the World would be born in humble beginnings. We are also taking a look at the shepherds that take part in the Christmas story. Shepherds in ancient times were considered some of the lowest people in society; they were thought to be unclean, rough, or even dangerous. Yet, these were the ones God sent a chorus of angels to summon to the side of His Son.

IN-DEPTH MARK BIBLE STUDY

Our Sunday night Bible study will be taking some time off during December because of all the commitments at the holidays. We will return on January 7th at 6pm. Until then, if you would like to join us in preparing, we will be reading through Mark 4:34-5:20. 
