JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!

As August comes to an end, our choirs continue to sing anthems and hymns born out of the Second Great Awakening. Sunday's anthem is based on a popular hymn, The Old Rugged Cross. In this hymn, the cross is a metonym; a word used as a substitute for something else closely related. It calls to mind something profound; a larger reality. The Cross of Christ is universally regarded as a symbol of our faith as Christians. The Cross of Christ centers around salvation. George Bennard began his ministry with the Salvation Army. He was later ordained by the Methodist Episcopal Church as a travelling Evangelist. During one troubling meeting in Michigan, Bennard was unsettled by the congregants' disregard for the Gospel. He turned to scripture to reflect on the work of Christ on the cross. He later recalled, "I seemed to have a vision, I saw Christ and the cross as inseparable." At a series of meetings in Albian, Michigan, George Bennard began and completed the first verse to his well-known hymn, The Old Rugged Cross. He later wrote, "The inspiration came to me one day in 1913, when I was staying in Albian, Michigan. I began to write *The Old Rugged Cross*. I composed the melody first. The words of the finished hymn were put in to my heart to answer my own need."

This Sunday, the Chancel Choir will sing Mary McDonald's lush and beautiful arrangement of Bennard's," The Old Rugged Cross." Her music will take us on a journey to the cross, where we will cherish not only the old rugged cross, but also the crucified Christ, the Son of God, who used the cross to seek and save all believers.

"The Old Rugged Cross" arr. by Mary McDonald On a hill far away stood an old rugged cross, the emblem of suffring and shame. And I love that old cross where the dearest and best for a world of lost sinners was slain.

Readings of John

Week 3

This week, we conclude our readings through the Gospel of John before we move into 1 John next week. These words we read this week are a testament to the life and works of Jesus Christ while He was here amongst us. The purpose behind these verses is best shown in John chapter twenty, verses thirty and thirty-one.

30 Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. 31 But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

These verses are part of a greater guide for us to see the true light of God Almighty. The stories of Jesus that we have read these few weeks in John give us a glimpse into what it was like to walk with Him, but it also gives us something more. It is a reminder that just because Jesus no longer walks physically on the Earth, still He walks with us in our spirits. Jesus still remains at our side, no matter what we face in our lives. We have to be willing to call on Him, each and every day. So believe in Him, and in all He has done.
