

Wynnton Neighborhood Network

For the period July - September of this year the Network served 148 families with utility assistance worth \$13,900. We also served 1,656 families with food. Those families contained 5,092 individuals including 2,165 children. Each day we serve our limit, 25 families. Last month alone we spent more than \$10,000 on groceries. The need for our services is great, and our appreciation for all our congregations who support us is even greater. Please continue your great work in the future. We depend on you.
