"I Lift My Eyes to the Hills"

The Lord watches over you— the Lord is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. The Lord will keep you from all harm—He will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.

We are given assurance that, in our darkest times, in our weakest moments, God is there ready to walk with us when we come under attack by the world. What a humbling way for us to show gratitude. What an amazing way to provide for us the ability to take the next step when we feel so weak and heavy burdened. During this time of Thanksgiving, I know that it may be difficult for so many to find the ability to give thanks, but realize that you are not carrying this burden alone. God is and always will be in control. I have faithfully believed that my entire life, and I cannot begin to think differently today. May we lift our eyes until the hills and focus on the mighty name of Jesus.

THANKSGIVING OFFERING


