#### "Give us Barabbas"

March 26, 2023

What is it that we say when we are faced with the tough decisions in life? I know when we all step into the heat of the moment there are decisions that are made that we fail to realize the full ramifications until we look back. There are moments that we all wish we could relive and choose another path or make a different choice. As we move into the final weeks of Lent, we are able this week to step into the story of one such decision made by the people of God.

As was the custom for Passover, the Governor in Jerusalem would provide an opportunity for one person to be released from their death sentence by popular acclaim as a gift to the people. In this instance, Jesus and Barabbas were brought before the people. Barabbas was mentioned in all 4 Gospels and referred to as a bandit, thief, and a revolutionist. He was a prisoner that was truly a thorn in the side of the Roman Government. One who they were ready to put to death and used as a pawn in hopes that the people would choose Jesus over Barabbas. Pilate places the decision in the hands of the religious leaders and God's people and almost immediately there were resounding voices proclaim, "Give us Barabbas." This was not what Pilate could even fathom the result would be from the people. With confusion Pilate then asks, "What should then be done with Jesus?" A deafening silence falls over the crowd and then the words that no one would have ever guessed.... "Crucify Him!"

Walking through this journey together, there are many days where we fail to realize the ramifications of our actions. There are situations when we too are asked whom shall we choose... Barabbas or Jesus? We fail to realize that we truly want to have Christ still on the cross in order that we can feel comfortable in our sin. I know that may seem harsh, but do we honestly continue to live in our sin and choose Barabbas so Jesus can still be visible as the propitiation for our sins?

This journey to the cross with Christ is not easy. In fact, it calls for us to fully surrender our lives in order that Christ may lift us up. We continue to think that we let Jesus down, but realize that even Barabbas was given the opportunity for freedom of his sins because of the sacrifice of Christ. See, Barabbas' name means son of the father or son of the teacher. Even though no one truly knows what happened to Barabbas after his encounter with Jesus, we do know that Barabbas was seen as an example of us. He was representing the death that we deserved and the forgiveness that Jesus was willing to do by standing in even for Barabbas....even for us.

So I ask us all this question, "What would you honestly do?" Would we still cry out for Barabbas in order that all of the grace, love and mercy of Christ would continue to fall upon us or would we step in his place? There was a purpose behind the words that were spoken for Barabbas and for us. May they continue to resonate in our hearts as a reminder that Christ not only chose Barabbas but also chose to pay our debt of death as well. Thank you God for total surrender of Christ and the mercy we receive when we never fully understood the ramifications of the debt that was paid.


