# Love God, Love People and Serve Together

## "Freedom Comes At a Cost"

## November 12, 2023

Galatians 5:1 says, "*It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.*" We have been called to live in freedom as we go forth and profess the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As we read the epistles Paul wrote, we recognize that he was very interested about living out his life for the sake of the Gospel. Even more importantly, Paul realized that this freedom that he was living out would come at an ultimate cost, his life. However, we see once again in Philippians 1:20-21 Paul's understanding of a life sacrificed for freedom. Paul wrote: "I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain."

Having this freedom in Christ truly does come at a cost. We have to be willing to reach a point in our lives where we surrender fully to God's call to serve. We have an attitude of gratitude to realize that if we have the privilege to wake up and live another day, we are excited to live out that day for the honor of living for Christ. Paul considered both options to be joy. If he had another day, he was going to do all that he could to help others understand the fullness of God's love, grace and mercy. If God was ready to bring him home, he was ready to live out eternity in the presence of Christ. There was not a down side to either of the choices.

This Sunday, we will be honoring others who were willing to understand that freedom comes at a cost. We will recognize that there are people who love this country and freedom so much that they willingly stood in the gap in order that we can live out our lives each day. Our daily freedom comes at a cost, and I cannot put into words the gratitude that I have to those who chose to pay the ultimate sacrifice. They, too, had the attitude to accept each day as it came with a joy that cannot be explained. They were willing to put their love into action in order that so many could experience a sacrificial love like no other.

As we live out each day, I pray that we will begin to understand Paul's call for servants who are willing to fully sell out for Jesus. I pray that we will no longer take any day for granted, but will look at each day as a new opportunity to pay back some of the debt that was paid on our behalf. It is for FREEDOM that I have been set free to profess the Gospel of Jesus Christ with every breath in my lungs. I know that is not an easy attitude to understand, but the closer that we grow in our relationship with God, the more we realize that we too have a cost to pay for the ongoing freedom for future generations. I pray that we are willing to take our place and stand in the gap in order that the Gospel of Jesus Christ will continue to be taught with the same spiritual fervor to future generations of the church.

Thank you for your sacrifice and the freedom we so take for granted!

## THANKSGIVING OFFERING



## **READING THROUGH THE BIBLE**

#### Weekly Scripture Reading Week 2

This week we finish reading the book of Galatians and start Ephesians. Ephesians, much like Galatians, is a letter to a group of Christians to remind them about living properly for Christ. In this case, Paul is telling them to continue doing good. It is a call to strive to grow in spiritual maturity. It also takes a new step for Christians by inviting both Jewish and Gentile people to the same table. Paul's lesson here is that you do not set up a wall between believers based on who they are, but that instead, you all are together in one body. This is a reminder to us in the present day of the Church of Jesus Christ. We are all in this together as children of God, one Church under Jesus. We are called to open the doors and welcome those who hold the Bible as truth. -Will
