JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!

In her devotional study, The Secret Garden of the Soul, Author Brigid Emily Herman shares this insight: "Every soul that is truly alive has a garden of which no other holds the key, a place where Jesus walks with His disciples, and a clash of the world cannot drown the music of His voice." With such beautiful imagery, I wonder if Ms. Herman's study was influenced by the poetry of C. Austin Miles, author and composer of the beloved hymn "In the Garden." Miles was a wellknown writer of gospel songs in the early 20th century. One day in March, 1912, he opened his Bible to his favorite chapter, John 20; the Resurrection story. Following a time of meditation focused on John's account of the resurrection of Jesus, C. Austin Miles envisioned himself standing at the entrance of the garden which held the tomb where Jesus was laid to rest. In his mind he saw Mary in the garden turning to see Jesus standing before her. Miles describes his vision ending as he, "...awakened in full light, gripping his Bible." Under the inspiration of his vision, he wrote quickly as his words formed the poetry to "In the Garden," just as we know it today.

This Sunday, the Chancel Choir will sing a Patti Drennan arrangement of "In the Garden," and will be joined by cellist Michael Knowles. Graceful poetry, fresh harmonies, expressive accompaniment, and a beautiful cello obligato combine to celebrate a joyous companionship experienced in the Garden with Jesus.


He speaks, and the sound of His voice is so sweet, the birds hush their singing; and the melody that He gave to me within my heart is ringing.

MOSES SCRIPTURE READINGS

Week 15
