My children, our love should not be just words and talk, It must be true love which shows itself in action.

In a daily devotion titled "The Hands of Jesus," American evangelist Billy Graham mentions the story of a church in Strasburg, Germany that was destroyed during the 2nd World War. Only a statue of Christ that was next to the altar remained mostly unharmed; the hands were missing. When the church was rebuilt, a sculptor offered to replace the hands. The members of the church decided to leave the statue without hands. The reason, they said: "Christ has no hands but our hands to do his work on earth. If we don't feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, talk to the stranger, visit the imprisoned, and clothe the naked, who will?" This Sunday's service will include a contemplative new anthem, "Touch That Soothes and Heals," arranged by Thomas Keesecker. The lyrics by Mary Louise Bringle reflect the message of 1John 3:18 and share the same hope as the words of the people of the church in Strasburg. Based on the hymn tune Civility, the rich text of "Touch That Soothes and Heals" is supported by graceful, exquisite melodies. The essence of this lovely anthem reflects the understanding that we see not only the wounded hands and feet of Jesus but, as Christians, we must also become the hands and feet of Christ in our world today; showing love and serving others.
