# "Essentials of Membership"

In 2 Peter 1:3-4 we read, "His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires." Peter is in Rome and realizing that his time on earth may be shortly lived, he pens the letter to the Church to encourage them to grow in their faith and realize the privilege that we have to be a part of the family of God. The major theme of this letter speaks to the faith of the members of God's church.

### A commentator on 2 Peter 1:3-4 wrote:

"If our faith is real, it will be evident in our godly behavior. Growth is ESSENTIAL. If people are diligent in Christian growth, they will not backslide or be deceived by false teachers. Growth begins with faith and culminates in love for others. To keep growing, we need to know God, keep following him, and remember what He taught us. We must remain diligent in faithful obedience and Christian growth."

# JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!

Merriam Webster defines Communion as a "Christian sacrament in which consecrated bread and wine are consumed as memorials of Christ's death, or as symbols for the realization of a spiritual union between Christ and communicant, or as the body and blood of Christ." It is also defined as an act or instance of sharing or fellowship. Both of these definitions are relevant to our services this Sunday as we celebrate World Communion Sunday with congregations all around the world. World Communion Sunday originated in 1933 when church leaders searched for an act or a symbol that would remind us of God's presence, even in difficult times. At the table of the Lord, in spite of our differences, we experience oneness and unity through Christ.

This Sunday, as we recognize the global perspective surrounding World Communion Sunday, our Sanctuary choirs will sing expressive communion anthems with rich harmonies and powerful refrains. They remind us that at the table of the Lord, we are one in Christ Jesus.


