Do Doubters Still Doubt? April 23, 2023

Have you ever had someone tell you something that you just are unable to believe? "The fish I caught was this big." Let's be honest, that fish was never as big as we said it was. We always added to it. But what if it was true? What if that fish was actually more than we have ever dreamed of? But because so many people have inflated their stories, we never want to believe them.

Thomas, the disciple we so often see as a skeptic, was a man who needed to see something to believe it. As much as we want to label Thomas as just a skeptic, too often we forget that we are a lot like him. We have been told so many inflated tales of worldly things that we so often forget that there are stories that can be real. Thomas did not want to believe in something that seemed so outside the norm that it was beyond what he could comprehend. In the case of Thomas, he needed to see it to be able to believe it. There's that old phrase from so many Christmas movies, "Seeing is believing." Doubters cannot doubt in the face of real truth.

What we are offered here in celebrating the Risen Savior, is a story that seems beyond anything we have ever heard before. Because it is, it is so far beyond anything humanity could have imagined. It seems like the greatest fish tale that has ever been told, up until it stands in front of you. Thomas was blessed because he could walk and talk with Jesus. He knew it was true because Jesus was right in front of his eyes.

But here's the thing: Jesus is right in front of us too. We so often overlook the hand of God in our lives, but every step we take is a testament to the grace and blessing of our Creator. As I walk down the halls of Wynnton, I know that Jesus is within those walls. He is not here because we called it a church, but instead He is here because everyone has made it a church. When you walk into that building, you bring Jesus with you.

What room is there for doubt when Jesus lives within you, and within the person sitting next to you on that pew. Jesus lives, and because He lives, we can face tomorrow without doubt. Open your eyes and see Jesus, because He's been waiting for you to see Him all your life. Do doubters still doubt? What room is there for doubt? Have faith, and see Jesus.

JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!

The life and the work of Fanny Crosby is a huge inspiration to me! Blind from infancy, she grew to become an American mission worker, poet, lyricist and composer. More than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs are attributed to her and over 100 million copies of her work have been printed. She is often referred to as the "queen of gospel songwriters," and the "mother of modern congregational singing." Fanny explains her life this way:

"It seemed intended by God that I should be blind all my life, and I thank Him for this dispensation. If perfect earthly sight were offered me tomorrow, I would not accept it. I might not have sung hymns to God, if I had been distracted by the beautiful and interesting things about me."

When asked to comment on Fanny Crosby's contributions to hymnody, hymn writer George C. Stebbins said, "No writer in her day appealed more to the valid experience of Christian life, or expressed more sympathetically the deep longing of the human heart than Fanny Crosby." One of her followers remarked that Fanny Crosby could not see with her eyes but she could see with her heart; she could not explain what a human face looked like but she knew the face of God. In 1877 Fanny met William J. Kirkpatrick, a prolific composer of gospel song tunes. Our Chancel Choir will sing John Carter's arrangement of "He Hideth My Soul" this Sunday, a hymn which resulted from the collaboration between Fanny Crosby and William Kirkpatrick. Based on Exodus 33:21-22, this unforgettable setting is both beautiful and inspirational. The lyrics reflect the faith of one who relied on the Lord and turned to Him for strength.

"He Hideth My Soul" arr. by John Carter A wonderful Savior is Jesus my Lord, a wonderful Savior to me; he hideth my soul in the cleft of the rock, where rivers of pleasure I see.

(refrain) He hideth my soul in the cleft of the rock that shadows a dry thirsty land; he hideth my life in the depths of his love, and covers me there with his hand. A wonderful Savior is Jesus my Lord, he taketh my burden away; he holdeth me up, and I shall not be moved, he giveth me strength for each day. (refrain) With numberless blessings each moment he crowns, and, filled with his fullness divine, I sing in my rapture, "O glory to God for such a Redeemer as mine!" (refrain)
