"Every time I recall these words, they are as fresh and shining as my first encounter with them"; a reference from the book, *3:16 The Numbers of Hope*, by Max Lucado. Lucado describes John 3:16 as a twenty-six-word parade of hope. The meaning of the words from this scripture is so well-loved that many Christians recognize March 16, as "John 3:16 Day!"

John Stainer wrote his powerful, well-known hymn "God So Loved the World" in 1887. His hymn served as inspiration to the more than a hundred choral anthems, many of which include his original melody. This Sunday, our Chancel Choir will sing Benjamin Harlan's arrangement of "God So Loved the World." Harlan uses flowing lines in the voices and accompaniment and treats his use of the original hymn by Stainer with gentleness and respect.
