"Live Out Loud"

September 10, 2023

Stephen Curtis Chapman wrote a song called *Live Out Loud* in 2009. It was a song that truly encapsulated the call of the Church to step out and tell the world about Jesus. I remember that it was probably the theme song for many camps and mission trips for years to come. His song was something that was so exciting and challenging as we were called to take the Light of God to a world in need. Just read the words of the chorus:

Wake the neighbors, get the word out Come on... crank up the music... climb a mountain and shout This is life we've been given meant to be lived out So la la la la live out loud, yeah Live out loud, yeah, yeah.

We are encouraged to go and tell the world about the explosive Word of God. A Word that is so powerful that it will continue to wake the neighbors and rattle the rafters. A message that is so powerful that once spoken it can infiltrate any barrier that has been built. As carriers of the Gospel, we are called to spread the Word of God that cannot be contained in our bodies. God's Word should be exuding out of us in such a way that others are drawn to us hoping to figure out what makes christians so different than other people in the world.

Another favorite song that continues to be a lifelong challenge for me living my faith out loud is the Hymn *Pass It On*. I know that I have shared the lyrics of this amazing hymn before, but I wanted to show you again how Kurt Kaiser allows us to see the power of God's message:

It only takes a spark to get a fire going, And soon all those around can warm up in its glowing; That's how it is with God's Love, Once you've experienced it, You spread_his love to everyone You want to pass it on. I'll shout it from the mountain top - PRAISE GOD! I want my world to know The Lord of love has come to me I want to pass it on.

Kaiser also demonstrates the PASSION of God's love that is living within us that is so powerful that we WANT to pass it on. Did you see that word? WANT... not have to... not obligated to because we go to church... not because we were forced to share to the world. There is such a powerful engagement with God in our lives that there is nothing else that we want to do more than Pass It On! The last part of the song is my favorite though. When Kaiser says, "I'll shout it from the mountain top-PRAISE GOD! I want my world to know. The Lord of love has come to me... I WANT TO PASS IT ON!

My prayer is that we once again step into this powerful message that has been living inside of us for many years. The Word of God has been planted within us, nurtured and continuously growing. Some of us for a short time, but for many of us, for decades. If we were able to show the world the power of God's Word living inside of us, would it look like the Redwood trees in California that are a marvel to see, or would it be a sapling still trying to break through the surface and show the world God's glory? I pray that we are all ready to Live Out Loud our faith for God. The world is in desperate need to wake the neighbors and get the Word out!

JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!

"Our hearts were made for You, O Lord, and they are restless until they rest in you." This is a famous passage from St. Augustine's *Confessions* between 397 and 400 AD. St. Augustine's familiar words echo the message of the lyrics for our choral anthem this Sunday. Composer Mary McDonald's heartfelt anthem, *Coming Home*, is the testimony of a believer who has wandered far from God but returns home, "...nevermore to roam." The text is inspired and adapted from William Kirkpatrick's conversion hymn, Lord, I'm Coming Home. William Kirkpatrick was a prolific American hymn writer; A Wonderful Savior is Jesus My Lord, Away in a Manger, Lead Me to Calvary, 'Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus, Redeemed, Singing I Go and Lord, I'm Coming *Home*, are among his many hymn contributions. Through his faith, the Lord led him to write lyrics and compose music that might compel the singer and the listener to know Christ. One such conversion story is told of a young singer who sang Kirkpatrick's hymn, Lord, I'm Coming Home. The lyrics of this hymn convicted the young singer's heart, and later that day he accepted Jesus into his life.

Sunday, our choirs will sing "Coming Home" by Mary McDonald. This anthem begins with an original, prayerful ballad by Mary McDonald and pairs with the hymn text of William Kirkpatrick's "Lord, I'm Coming Home." Crafted with beautiful, contemplative harmony, it is an exquisite anthem of repentance and forgiveness.
