"Grace is a Five Letter Word"

April 21, 2024

This week I hope and pray that we are ALL able to recognize a different understanding of our role in grace. Sunday, we spoke of being TOGETHER in grace. We are a family working together in doing all that we can to help others to experience the fullness of God's grace. I know that it is difficult for many of us to actually fathom the grace of God, but as we receive, we are called to give. We are challenged not to keep to ourselves the Gospel story of Jesus that edifies grace. We are mere examples of God's grace that was demonstrated in such a beautiful way that the world truly could not understand. Simply put, Grace is a five-letter word...Jesus!

As we dive into this past week's sermon, I want to bring back just one point. Grace is not a gift that God packages and bestows on us and on creation. Grace is God's presence to create, heal, forgive, reconcile and transform human hearts, communities and the entire creation. Wherever God is present, there is grace! Grace brought creation into existence. Grace birthed human beings, bestowed on us the divine image, redeemed us in Jesus Christ and is ever transforming the whole creation into the realm of God's reign of compassion, justice, generosity and peace. What a beautiful and living understanding of grace.

As we walk in grace TOGETHER, it means that we are to look at everyone we encounter through the lens of grace and realize that we are not the only ones that are sharing this grace to the world. We are partners working TOGETHER to fulfill the Great Commission of Christ by going out into the world, making disciples and baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:16-20). A full understanding of working together to show grace is seen in every aspect of our church. As I mentioned Sunday, we have an amazing staff that truly loves God and serves for the joy of sharing the Gospel in their lives. We have volunteers that continue to equip and create ministries for the needs of our community. We have leaders who are willing to sacrifice their time and use their gifts to help fulfill the vision that God has laid out for our congregation. There are so many examples that I experience every day that demonstrate our willingness to serve TOGETHER in grace.

What is the reason we all do this? Jesus! I really want this to sink in for a second. The reason we are so connected and inspired to do so much is because the grace of Christ has covered over us. The love of Jesus flows through our veins and drives us to help others to experience this same joy. For me, I celebrate God's grace through Christ every day because, as a child, I constantly felt as though I did not deserve such a sacrifice. I found myself wondering why God was willing to give so much for me when there are so many others that are more deserving. But when Jesus came into my life, I was able to open my eyes and see that not only was God's grace sufficient to cover over my sins, it was sufficient to cover over the multitude of sins for ALL of creation. As a child, my mind struggled to understand the vastness of grace, but as I continued to grow in my faith, I realized there is NOTHING, but our choice, that can separate us from the love of God (Romans 5:35-37).

We are bonded TOGETHER because of the love Christ demonstrated in showing us GRACE from the cross. As the CHURCH universally, we are joined TOGETHER to form the body of Christ and with each cell we are conjoined by grace. It is truly exciting to know that we are not alone, but that God is at work, not only in and through us, but also through hundreds of millions, if not more, all around the world. We have been given this place to work TOGETHER to show God's grace to the people of Columbus, and I pray that we understand that there is NO limit to the power that Jesus demonstrated as He took the cup of God's wrath and turned it into a gift of Grace. Grace - God's Riches At Christ's Expense - will forever be a five-letter word...Jesus!
