"If We Never See It... How Does It Grow?"

I remember when I was in elementary school and we did the experiment of the seed in the styrofoam cup. This experiment was a simple example to demonstrate the process of life being expressed through the simplicity of using just a few things: a seed, dirt, a styrofoam cup, water and sunlight. When you put all of the things together it teaches us a valuable lesson about God and life. I remember every day running to my classroom after I was dropped off to see if anything had changed. For the first week, it seemed like nothing had happened at all. I honestly doubted myself and thought that maybe I did something wrong for the seed not to grow. But what I didn't realize was there was a lot going on underneath the surface that I could not see. There were things that God was doing that were not ready to be revealed until God was ready for them to be revealed. Then, the day came that that seedling burst through the ground and I could finally see God's work first-hand. Daily, I would leave the cup with a fresh amount of water and overnight I would anxiously wait to see how it would look the next day.

As we continue to move into this time of deepening our discipleship in Mark 4, we find this example found in verses 26-29 may be short in words but powerful in meaning. Once again Jesus is speaking in parable form to let us know that God has always been at work underneath the surface before we will ever see the product. If we are willing to receive the Word of God in our lives, it will stir within us in such a way that change is happening even when we cannot see it. In the example of the seed, we have to realize that the seed has to die in order for the plant to grow. The seed will begin to sprout roots and absorb nutrients filtering in and out what it needs to grow and survive. In the same way, God's Word is doing the same in our hearts. It is to die to self and helps us to filter in and out the things that we need to survive and grow.

I say this because change in life truly does take time. Now, understand that I also believe that God can change lives instantly. We saw that all throughout the Bible, but for real impact to occur in our community it will take time. We have to be willing to continue to water and provide the LIGHT to help the process to continue. We have to continue to run with excitement to pour into the lives of those God has placed in our path to see the power of what God is doing in their lives. IT TAKES TIME. As a person who continues to pray and anticipate how God is going to make our seedling called Wynnton grow, I rush every day to see the difference that God has made in the lives of our people. I strive to be patient and realize that God has to do His work before real change can occur.

Just because we may never fully see the change in the speed that we want to see, does not mean that God is not working. In this life, we are called to do for others. For some, we may be the place that plants the seed for some. Other times, we may have the privilege to water, nurture, weed and provide a healthy environment that allows someone to filter in and out what they need to grow. And with others, we may receive the privilege of the fruit that is the byproduct of other people who have been praying and waiting for the seed to breakthrough the soil. Regardless of what stage of life we are privileged to be a part of in someone's life, we can say for certain that it is ONLY GOD that can make it grow. So if we cannot see it... it may not be meant for us to see this person in their current state of life. But one thing is certain, God is definitely doing something beneath the surface and when He is ready, it will be shown to the world.

READING THROUGH THE BIBLE

MOSES SCRIPTURE READINGS Week 9

Our readings for this week come from the book of Leviticus. Leviticus is a book of rules, the history of the journey of God's people's relationship with Him. These chapters lay out the details for offerings to the Lord and some details on those who would oversee this work. We are talking about the priests. Aaron and his sons were to be the first to lead worship for God. It was their job to ensure that proper offerings were made before the Lord. It is this work that laid further foundation for the New Covenant that would come. Through the work of Moses and Aaron there was something to build on. These sacrifices were only needed because they were temporary. The only thing that would finish it would be a sacrifice of something beyond compare. Even back in Leviticus, God was laying the groundwork for the greatest act of grace ever known. As you read this week, look at the traditions of God's people, the Old Covenant, and how it will be built upon to make something greater.
